

FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for Village of Bal Harbour's beach repair due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 06217). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

- Location of Proposed Work:** R-27 to R-31 (25.89946, -80.12247 to 25.88715, -80.12145)
- Floodplain:** Project is located in the AE zone, area of 100-yr flooding, and the VE Zone, otherwise known as the Coastal High Hazard Area, per Miami-Dade County FIRM Panel #12086C0163 L, dated 09/11/2009.
- Proposed Work and Purpose:** Village of Bal Harbour will replace sand and sea oats lost as a result of Hurricane Irma. Approximately 330.6 cubic yards of sand and 9,000 sea oats will be replaced using beach compatible sand obtained from a permitted upland source. The county is responsible for obtaining USACE and FDEP permits for the work and for confirming compliance with permit conditions.
- Project Alternatives:** The alternative that has been considered is the no action alternative. This alternative is not feasible as the area will remain vulnerable to flood risk, including property damage and hazards to human life and safety. With the no action alternative, continued negative impacts on adjacent infrastructure, property, residents, and the community may be experienced. Alternate locations were not considered as the beach is functionally dependent upon its location within the floodplain. The facility also provides open space uses for recreation and habitat for wildlife.
